




What we know about the growing use of prescription opioids in Ontario



Opioid Rx's per 100 population by LHINs 2015/2016





Safe Opioid Prescribing

The Safer Opioid Prescribing Program includes a Webinar Series (3 webinars), followed by an in-person Skill Development workshop.









- Expanding treatment networks throughout the province
- Educational content and courses with partners (in person)
- Subject matter expertise



College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario



- Have identified and contacted highest risk prescribers
- On a path of assisting in a non-punitive way with guidance and steering people to seek help without acting reflexively
- Public safety: do not want abrupt withdrawal of narcotics



Association of Family Health Teams of Ontario



- QIDSS support for data analysis on the EMR
- Quality reporting through D2D
- EMR algorithms to identify at risk patients on opidoids
- Working with CAMH on education delivery



Practice Based Approach

- Tier 1 High Risk
 - High volume Rx
 - High dose Rx
 - High risk patient population
- Tier 2 Medium Risk
 - Medium risk practices due to patient population or prescribing variance
- Tier 3 Average Risk
 - Average practices



Individualized Support

- Assistance to physicians to meet their needs and support analysis of their practice
- Education for change in prescribing habits
- Assistance with skills in reducing narcotic starts
- Learning about techniques for gradual tapering where appropriate
- Ensuring that doctors do not feel alone in the journey

- Morphine Equivalents (MEQs)
- List high dose patients
- List patients on opioids and benzo's
- Narcotics contracts
- Screening tools ORT, BPI, ...




