Tip from a Peer Leader: Graphing Labs and INR Tracking (Accuro®)

HRM Task Force Updates



Health Report Manager (HRM[®]) has been around for over 10 years and is used by about 14,000 clinicians to receive health reports in their EMRs. OMD wants to make sure it continues to be a valuable tool for you so we convened an HRM Experience Improvement Task Force and three working groups in spring 2022 to work on eliminating HRM pain points. This takes the cooperation of all HRM stakeholders— Ontario Health, hospitals, EMR vendors, HIS vendors and their decision makers—to execute the Task Force's recommended solutions. This is the latest update on our work:

The Sending Facility Standards Working Group met on December 12 to understand the impact of high volumes of reports on patients and clinicians and the current state perspective from a hospital lens. Options for addressing high volumes of reports (e.g., unnecessary reports) were reviewed and discussions will continue in the new year on this issue and all pain points brought to the Task Force, along with potential options for addressing them.

OMD Digital Health Advocacy

OMD advocates on behalf of physicians to ensure digital health tools, such as EMRs, as well as virtual care technologies, meet your practice and patient care needs. As part of these efforts, we engage in important discussions online and in the media. We also attend partner events in the health care community to engage with you, your staff and other health care stakeholders.

Trillium Health Partners Stops Fax Duplicates for HRM Users



Trillium Health Partners (THP) has implemented a new system called Report Distribution Standardization Portal (RDSP) which provides an interface layer on top of Epic that allows for better direction of reports to the intended clinician by their chosen communication preference. This will stop duplicate faxes for HRM users. If you use HRM, you do not have to do anything. THP will continue to send you lab results only by fax.

THP listened to community-based clinicians to implement this change to address their needs. This tremendous achievement aligns with the mandate of the HRM Task Force to improve the clinician user experience with report flow from hospitals to the community. This fax suppression initiative will save practices time that is better spent on patient care. Congratulations to THP for achieving this milestone and leading the Epic-based hospitals!

HRM Report Delivery from Hôpital Montfort and the OTNHub

In January, Hôpital Montfort will begin sending Medical Record (MR) and Diagnostic Imaging (DI) reports through HRM.

In January, the OTNHub will enable new functionality that will allow clinicians to choose the eConsult reports they wish to transmit through HRM *or* automatically send eConsult reports.

View Pharmacy Flu Shots and Other Drug Data with the DHDR



Fast-track your patient outreach efforts this flu season! With access to <u>drug information</u> <u>through your EMR</u> from the Digital Health Drug Repository (DHDR), you can now see which of your patients have received a flu shot at the pharmacy. Also, securely view other important medication information, such as dispensed drugs covered under the Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) Program, narcotics or controlled substances, and COVID-19 vaccination information.

eForms: Say Goodbye to Faxed Forms

OMD is making form completion easier for you. We are working with Ontario Health and the Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) as a first step to automate the cumbersome form-filling process, and eliminate faxes, with the launch of <u>eForms</u>.

eForms are digital forms that you can complete from the convenience of your EMR. They are an improvement over other digital forms in EMRs, which when submitted, arrive as faxes at the receiving organization. You no longer have to fax paper or



digitally to various organizations, only to have them be sent back due to being outdated versions, or because something was missing. We're only getting started with eForms. There are 16 forms from the Ministry of Transportation available and more forms are coming!

eForms is now available to Accuro[®] EMR, YES EMR and YMS EMR users. Make form submission easier for yourself and request eForms today! Other EMR vendors will be offering eForms this winter.

Are You Moving? HRM Needs to Know Where You Are!



Just like the post office, HRM needs to know where to deliver your reports. Moving? Switching Internet providers? Changing your Internet plan? Choosing a new EMR? These scenarios could potentially mean a change to your IT delivery address, disrupting your HRM feed and stopping your reports from hospitals and specialty clinics. HRM only delivers to locations it trusts, so <u>don't forget to notify</u> <u>OMD</u> at <u>support@ontariomd.com</u> when making a change. We need a <u>minimum</u> <u>of 7 business days</u> from the time we receive your <u>complete</u> request with a <u>valid</u> IP address to ensure you don't experience any disruptions to report delivery.
